They stand simply as a basis for showing that we can come together as the collective Body of Christ and be united not under a denomination, religion, or political affiliation - but under one name, the name of Jesus!

About God - God is the Creator and Ruler of the universe. He eternally exists in three personalities: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. These three are coequal and are one God.
